Dear St. Michael Family,

It takes a church to raise a child. A whole community of believers is needed in children's lives for them to grow faithfully into people of God. To learn and experience their faith in a loving and caring environment is the goal of Vacation Bible School. I want to give a big THANK YOU to all the people who helped make virtual VBS happen this year and to the adults who faithfully participated along with their children.

Every year VBS offers a chance for the church to pull out all the stops to create an unforgettable experience for our children and this year was no exception as we met online. Research shows connections made during VBS result in children who grow into adults and retain a life of faith. VBS is a special event that creates memories that help lock God's truth into the hearts and minds of our children for a lifetime.

This year we had nineteen children participate online over a period of four weeks. Our theme was "Building Your Faith Toolbox" with the focus on the importance of discipleship, music, prayer and church.

Did you know VBS is important to the whole church? Just think about it; as adults we know that the maturing of our faith takes time; in fact it takes a lifetime. What we tend to forget is that it takes the whole community in Christ to help us grow and it starts at birth. VBS should never be thought of as adults teaching down to our children, but rather it is learning together as we grow in faith.

This growth is revealed in each of us as we learn to live out the commandments of the New Testament: Love one another, forgive each other, and regard each other more highly than ourselves. Teach and correct each other, encourage each other, pray for each other and bear each other's burdens. Be friends with one another, be kind, be compassionate and be generous in hospitality. Serve one another and submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. This list just scratches the surface but it is enough to remind us that we need the community of faith to grow up in Christ.

VBS is a time that we, individually and together, grow in faith, embodying the very "fullness of Christ."

Micah's Backpack Sharing the Story



On August 9, 2020, John Stramiello was approved by the St. Michael Church Council as the new Director of Micah's Backpack Program (MBP), replacing Sarah Ryan. Sarah has done a wonderful job organizing and growing this program during her tenure as director. She will be missed but not forgotten. John has an extensive background in feeding ministries dating back to 2009 when he founded Behind the Stone Ministries in Florida, handing out bags of food to 125 families a week. Over the past few weeks John

has been working closely with Sarah and the MBP Advisory Board to seek new ways to continue this much-needed ministry, especially during this time of COVID-19 and the issues it poses. We continue to need the support of our volunteers and donors who have been the backbone of MBP because of their Time, Talents and Treasures. We are continuing to pack and distribute 100 bags to the seniors at Warm Hearth. We are getting food from both Feeding America and Kroger. We are packing the bags at the church with 4 volunteers and then the staff at Warm Hearth picks up the bags about 4-5 days later and they give out the bags to the seniors. At this time, we are packing generic bags and are not



following our normal "menu" option as in the past. However, this seems to be working well and the bags contain quite a few of the basic items- tuna/ peanut butter/ soup / spaghetti / cereal / fruit cups and crackers. We recently received a Covid-19 response grant from the Virginia Synod for \$400 and that allowed us to buy the food we distributed in August. Millstone Kitchen has now connected with Warm Hearth and they provided some hot meals to the seniors the 3rd week in August. We look forward to finding out how that worked and how long they will provide the warm meals. We are excited we have found a way to still assist the low-income seniors at Warm Hearth and look forward to continuing our program in this manner. We appreciate everyone's support as we feed those in need.

Attention Older Kids (O.K.s)

Well, we have to cancel our Happy-Go-Lucky Gourmet School Luncheon this year but I think we should still do our homework. Homework you say! What's that all about? To keep our minds healthy and nimble, a little set of "lessons" have been prepared....a bit of history, some art, can't forget the math, and more. Along with your homework delivered right to your door, you also get to chat (through the screen door of course) with your personal delivery person. A school snack or two will also be included. ©

Council continues to meet monthly to take care of the business of St. Michael. At the August meeting it was suggested that capital improvement projects be considered since the mortgage has been paid. Two projects that have been suggested are redoing the kitchen and replacing the sanctuary carpet. Council continues to work on reopening worship plans. A letter will be sent out soon with a draft plan for reopening. Please look over the draft plan and offer support and suggestions. We continue to monitor the coronavirus in the area to guide us in our decisions.

St. Michael Landscape

Virginia has a new state champion Evodia tree and it is on the grounds of StMLC. The church grounds now have the largest as well as the third largest Evodia tree in the state. The new champion is to the west of the large fenced playground at the church.

These trees are both recognized by the Virginia Big Tree Program, which is headquartered at the College of Natural Resources and Environment at Virginia Tech. Listings of trees can be found on-line at <u>http://bigtree.cnre.vt.edu/</u> Use the 'Search Big Trees' box to look for Korean Evodia.

Trees earn points based on height, trunk circumference, and canopy diameter. Every foot of height earns 1 point, every inch of trunk circumference earns 1 point, and every foot of canopy diameter earns $\frac{1}{4}$ point... The champion at the church is 56 feet tall, 80 inches in circumference, and has a canopy that is 33 feet wide (for 8 pts.) earning a total of 144 points.

Our third place tree, (previously co-champion) is closer to the parking lot west of the church and earns 122 points.

Korean Evodia is native to China and Korea. It flowers profusely in July with umbels of small white flowers.



Scout Troop 158



Troop 158 has not met at the church since March, but the Scouts have remained active. Scouts have continued to meet via Zoom, and have earned rank advancements and merit badges in Public Speaking and Emergency Preparedness. They even had a couple of campouts via Zoom, where families camped by themselves, but used Zoom to stay connected and have campfire programs. The troop had one inperson campout in July.

On August 8, nine Scouts and six adults met at StMLC where they raked and weeded the mulched beds. They also spread three cubic yards of playground mulch on the playground, to prepare it for the children attending Mother's Morning Out, which has restarted.

Jay and Becci Nagle and New River Engraving step up to the pandemic

You may not know this, but nearly the Nagle family at their company, New River Engraving, has created every sign and plaque around St. Michael. Faced with a possible loss of business this past spring due to the coronavirus, Jay and Becci retooled the company....because of the coronavirus! With a good supply of acrylic, they are now making PPE's....personal protection equipment for schools, businesses, and hospitals. At the beginning of the pandemic, they created, donated and distributed intubation boxes (see below) all around the country. These are boxes placed



over COVID-19 patients in hospitals to protect doctors and



nurses. They have now devised a new and improved disposable model which is in huge demand at local hospitals such as Carilion. New River Engraving staff, which includes sons Zach and Cam and daughter-in-law Mary, are also engineering counter shields, which have to be custom measured for each application, e.g., grocery checkout. Nearly every department at Virginia Tech has ordered the shields and the company has developed many new partnerships within the university. A third product is face shields and the

company cannot keep up with demand.

The new products have allowed New River Engraving to keep all their staff fully employed and incredibly busy. Their first choice though would be going back to creating their beautiful award plaques and other celebratory products rather than virus-related products. Nevertheless, we are all grateful that Jay and Becci and their company are making a difference by protecting health workers, students, and our entire community.
