Greetings Dear People of God!

As we continue to sit in anticipation awaiting the coming of the Christ Child it is hard not to get caught up in the season of Christmas before its time. Retailers seem to be working especially hard this year to get us into the Christmas spirit by decking their stores with all the decor and music of the season two months in advance. October has become the new November when it comes to Christmas sales. Needless to say, retailers don't understand the church's tradition of Christmas. Maybe this year amidst the pandemic we can stop and ask ourselves - what's the hurry? After all Christmas should last twelve days.

Christmas Day is the first of the Twelve Days of Christmas. The period is viewed as the amount of time it took the three magi, or wise men, to travel to Bethlehem for the Epiphany, the revelation of Jesus Christ as the Savior and the Son of God ("epiphany" is from the Greek word for "revelation"). In my house baby Jesus is never placed in the manger before Christmas Eve and the magi make a long twelve day journey from one end of my living room to the nativity at the other end of the living room on Epiphany. These mostly quiet and contemplative twelve days have become sacred in my house, reminding me of the hush of the landscape after freshly fallen snow. It is a deeply intimate time with Christ while the rest of the world is done with Christmas. After it is over and long forgotten, John and I still sit in awe of this Child who comes to save the world.

So, what if we gave ourselves over wholeheartedly to the Twelve Days of Christmas this year? What if, like the shepherds who were keeping watch over their flocks, we too were surprised and rejoiced in the angel's words: "Do not be afraid; for see – I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11)?

How would our understanding of Christmas be changed if we, with great joy like the shepherds, left the tradition of Christmas being a one day event in order to keep moving towards Bethlehem, the place where the promised Christ is reveled to those that sought him. If we placed our faith in the promises of God and enter into the shepherds' excitement and eagerness this Christmas, perhaps we can regain the wonder of Christmas joy and the peace that is offered to us. As a church that that belongs to Christ, I invite you to journey into these Twelve Days of Christmas. After the retailers are done and most people are sighing a sigh of relief for another Christmas past, our Saviour invites you to revel in the excitement and joy of salvation that saves us from sin.

Wait for it, and then may the calm of the Christmas season refresh you and give you hope.

End-of-Year Giving and IRA Required Minimum Distribution Information

If you are planning to make a gift at the end of the year to support the ministry of St. Michael, remember that the IRS requires all gifts for 2020 to be received by the church or post-marked by December 31, 2020. You can make gifts to support the core ministry and to other ministries of St. Michael. You can find more information about these funds or donate online at: http://www.st-michael-lutheran-church.org/donations/. If you need assistance with tax advantageous gifts like gifts of stock or donations of minimum distributions from an IRA, contact Doug Smiley.

If you are 70 ½ years old and need to take a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA, you have an opportunity to support St. Michael Lutheran Church and save money on your taxes. Under the current tax law, a gift made directly from an IRA to a qualifying charitable organization counts toward your required IRA minimum distribution requirement. Making a gift directly from your IRA to St. Michael Lutheran Church allows you to support a ministry you love and to lower both your adjusted gross income and your taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability. Talk to your tax advisor to find out if this strategy will work for you.

Micah's Backpack is overjoyed to announce we have **Izzy** the bus back in action. Due to generous donations and grants we have been able to fix all the mechanical issues. Izzy has been detailed inside and out. New banners and stickers from Signspot complete the makeover. Thank you to Signspot for their creativity and awesome work. From August 2020 until today we have had 6 different organizations hosting food drives. 38 individuals and 11 different organizations dropped off food donations for a total of more than 7,000 items. We still have 3 more groups hosting food drives for us.

We have met the Cummings/Ivers challenge for the first \$1,000 match and Connie and Joe have put up another \$1,000 to be matched. We can do this for the kids! Thank you, Connie and Joe, for your caring hearts.

On Saturday, November 14th, Izzy made its debut at the Rising Silo Brewery for the First Annual Food Cycle Event. This food drive benefits Micah's Backpack Program and The Roanoke Rescue Mission. On November 11th, the Women's Lacrosse Team from Virginia Tech brought us food they collected. The total number of donated items was 2,217. Way to go ladies!!!

Last but not least Pastor Monica from Luther Memorial has informed MBP that the Social Ministry Committee has agreed to donate \$1,500 to MBP for infrastructure needs. We are looking forward to having LMLC alongside us in this community driven ministry.

Micah's Soup for Seniors

We are continuing to pack and distribute 100 food bags to seniors at Warm Hearth. We pack the bags at the church with 4 volunteers. Four or five days later staff from Warm Hearth pick up the bags to hand out to the seniors. At this time we are packing generic bags and not offering our normal menu options as in the past. This seems to be working well and the bags contain quite a



few basic items – tuna, peanut butter, soup, spaghetti, cereal, fruit cups and crackers. We are pleased we have found a way to still help out the low income seniors at Warm Hearth and look forward to continuing our program in this manner. We appreciate everyone's support as we feed those in need. We will be collecting 16 oz. jars of **peanut butter** in December. You may drop off those donations at the church.

For the December food bags, we would like to add a small Christmas gift bag. We are collecting **slipper type socks** and **lotions** to give out. If you wish to donate either or both these items, please drop them off at the church **before** December 18th, packing day.

Greeters, Ushers and Readers

With plans to begin in-person church services in the new year I will be scheduling greeters, ushers and readers for those Sundays. Following the guidelines recommended by the CDC for physical distancing, one greeter/usher will be stationed at the Bell Tower entrance to open the door and manage the flow of members entering the church. Two greeters/ushers will be stationed at the sanctuary entrance to hand out bulletins and the prepared sacraments and to escort the member/members to the end of the pew. One or two folks may be seated at the other end of the pew. Families in the same household can sit together. Only half the pews will be available. At the conclusion of the service members will be asked to remain in the pews. Ushers will then direct church members to the Bell Tower exit following physical distancing guidelines. Reflecting and Looking Ahead

Thank you to all those individuals who have kept the work of St. Michael going forward during this year. When the coronavirus closed down regular services, there was a pause. After realizing church work couldn't stop, members got back to work. The Church Council missed the April meeting but resumed monthly meetings in May. Since God's work had to continue, we just had to adapt.

Micah's Caring Initiative adjusted its programs to remain active. Micah's Backpack found ways to deliver to students. Micah's Closet was able to supply students with clothing in the spring and fall. Micah's Soup for Seniors adjusted the handling of packing and delivery of food and resumed the program in May. Micah's Garden had a healthy garden producing much needed fresh food for Micah's Backpack and local food banks.

Vacation Bible School was held online in July. Families of Faith began meeting online in August and adult Sunday School started up online in September. Twice monthly midweek gatherings with Pastor Michelle provide a time to keep up with members. Happy Go Lucky folks were treated with a personally delivered packet for the September meeting.

Worship services are different with weekly online services and monthly drive-in services. Council has prepared for opening in person services and will let you know when that will begin with online services still available for those that prefer to stay home.

Many of our special projects have continued in one form or another including Easter baskets, Love offering, breakfast for Price's Fork teachers, school supplies for Price's Fork students, supplies for the Women's Resource Center, Linus blankets, Community Thanksgiving Dinner and To Our House.

There have been many challenges and new ways of doing things, but we have met the challenges and continue to look for ways to adapt to the changing times. Thank you for

staying loyal to the mission of St. Michael by faithfully sending in your offerings and attending online and drive-in services when possible. We will be back together, it will be different, but we are God's people and He will help us through this difficult time.
