Welcome to Lent dear people of God!

The invitation to Lent spoken on Ash Wednesday reminds us that we as God's people enter this season together. We are created for communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. Though many common Lenten practices rightly invite us to individual acts of repentance, **prayer** and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love, Lent is also a time for deepening of community.

The question for this year is how do we grow in our faith together when we are isolated? Here are some ways we can deepen our community during Lent this year:

- *Pray for one another: Praying for others is a way to care for someone, even if they are halfway across the world. When we pray for others we offer them a piece of our faith, our belief and our heart. Praying for others leads us to a deeper sense of community that sustains us through every challenge.
- * Daily Bible reading: The Bible teaches us vocabulary in our relationship with God and with each other. We don't read the Bible just to read our Bibles. We read with the goal to commune with God and with all God has created. As we grow in knowledge of God's word, we become more aware of God's voice in our day-to-day life. As we consider how to respond to one another, stories from the Old Testament and New Testament will come into view. The more we read, the more alive and active our relationships become. When we learn the language of God's own heart we engage our community more authentically.
- * Enter into the discipline of mid-week worship: I know Zoom isn't for everyone, but what we feel makes God no less relevant than expressing our feelings in person. God shows up even when we don't because for God it is a matter of the heart. When we come with an expectant heart God is found there with us. To be a Christian means that we are part of the body of Christ, the Church. There is no such thing as an isolated and solitary Christian. In this way, all Christians are part of the Church, part of the community, and when you are not present the body misses you.
- *Send a card: Now is a good time to let someone in the community know they are missed. Pick up your church directory and look through the names and think of the things you miss about that person: their smile, their laugh, your Sunday morning conversations, hearing them read during church, sharing that morning cup of coffee together at the table. Whatever it is, write them a note and let them know. A handwritten letter says that we care and are willing to give personal attention to our siblings in Christ.
- *Make a phone call: Hearing someone's voice is always something very special, much more so if you don't get to see them as often as you'd like.
- * Sunday service: Watch online and come to the drive-in service on the fourth Sunday of every month. Open your heart to being a part of community in these difficult times until we can meet safely in person. As a pastor feeling her way through a pandemic, this community has shown me that God shows up every Sunday regardless of what church looks like.

- * Sunday School: Come and join this faith-filled group of people at 6:00 p.m. to discover God at work in the midst of community. Sunday School provides a place to belong. In a Sunday School class we are known personally as God's people. It is a place where we share needs and concerns from our lives. It helps us build meaningful relationships by hearing each other's stories. We share fellowship time with class members. We minister alongside others.
- * Write a letter or article for the weekly newsletter: Have some news you want to share? A feeling or idea you want to express? Then write it down and submit it to me via email for the weekly newsletter.

These are some of the ways we can deepen our communal Lenten journey together even though we are physically apart, but I encourage you to be creative. There is someone in this community that is longing to hear from you, to see you. So be of good courage and reach out trusting what God does.

Vaccinate VIRGINIA

This is an update from the Virginia Department of Health about the status of COVID-19 vaccinations in Virginia. The available supply of vaccine is still very limited around the country, and **we know the wait has been frustrating**.

The good news is that state and local public health officials and many partners have been working tirelessly to get vaccines to as many people as possible, as quickly as possible:

- More than 1.4 million doses have already been administered by Virginia, including nearly 95% of the first doses available to the state. You can track Virginia's progress on the <u>Vaccine Dashboards</u>.
- Virginia ranks 12th among all states for percent of the population that has received at least one dose, and 9th among all states for percent of available doses administered, according to CDC data presented by the <u>New York</u> <u>Times</u>.

Today, we launched a **new statewide vaccine pre-registration system**, to make it easier for people to sign up for a free COVID-19 vaccination. If you receive an email containing the information on this page, you have been transferred automatically to the new statewide system and **you do not need to do anything at this time**. You will maintain your current status, and can confirm that you are in the new system at any time, at <u>vaccinate.virginia.gov</u>.

The country still needs more vaccine supply to be able to get shots in the arms of everyone who wants them. **Unfortunately, it may take weeks or months** before everyone currently on waitlists is able to make an appointment. Although the complexities of vaccine distribution do not make it possible to give an estimated appointment date, we will send you regular reminders that you are still on the pre-registration list.

When your appointment becomes available, there will be no charge. State and local agencies will never call, email or text you to ask for your social security number or immigration status in connection with vaccination.
