Greetings Dear People of God,

It is no secret that some people go to church regularly, some go occasionally, and others seldom go at all, but how important is church participation to you? Are there good reasons why you should go to church?

The gathering of God's people in church is critical to our spiritual life because it fills a void in us that only the church (the body of Christ) can. If our car needs fixing, we would take it to an automotive repair shop. If we, or someone we love, is sick we would see a doctor or go to the hospital. The church is where we go when we are in need of the good news of Jesus Christ. Martin Luther said, "The church is a hospital for sinners and not a museum for saints." And what is sin? It is anything we put our trust in, other than Christ, to save us. We are all guilty of sin and in need of the good news.

With all the weight and pressures of this life weighing down on us, we have an expectation that the church will help to provide Biblical base answers that no other institution can provide. "Lord to whom shall we go, for you have the words of eternal life."

The Bible calls on believers to be the church, and not just go to church. But to effectively be the church, we need to faithfully gather with the other members of the body of Christ for equipping and encouragement.

After months of isolation, due to the pandemic, we are going to have to work at discovering anew how sacred and life-giving it is to attend Church, and how much we ache when we're denied the means to do so. Hopefully, isolation has taught us how much our faith life is dependent on proximity to one another.

The Scriptures advise us "not to give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another, even more as you see the day of the Lord approaching" (Hebrews 10:25). Why not come to church next Sunday and rediscover what it means to be the church in our community every day? Let us not take for granted the miracle of gathering together and all the gifts that are found in being the body of Christ for the sake of the world, the church and one another.

On July 13th we began packing bags for the Micah's Mobile Backpack Summer Program. We partnered with Aloha Eddie's Snow Cones for

the delivery of bags on July 15th. We received free pizzas from Domino's Pizza for delivery on the July 22nd, and 120 free mini subs from Jersey Mike's Subs for delivery on the 29th. Chase Biegler, manager at Jersey Mike's, joined us on the bus to hand out the food and subs to our students.

We are continuing to pack and distribute over 100 bags to the seniors at Warm Hearth. We are getting food from both Feeding America and Kroger. We are starting back to our almost normal routine of packing the bags at the church with volunteers and then loading up the cars and



delivering them to Warm Hearth. We are being asked at this time to only knock at the door and leave the bags. Since we are packing generic bags and are not following our normal menu option as in the past this worked well during our delivery in June. The bags contain quite a few of the basic items: tuna, peanut butter, soup, spaghetti, cereal, fruit cups and crackers plus any special items we may be able to get from Feeding America.

We will be packing and delivering the 4th Tuesday of each month. At this time, we are going to try a new time-packing at 10 a.m. and then leaving immediately after to deliver.

We are happy to be back delivering to the seniors at Warm Hearth and look forward to continuing our program in this manner.

We will be collecting **chicken noodle soup** for the month of **August**.
