Micah's Soup for Seniors

We are continuing to pack and distribute over 100 bags to the seniors at Warm Hearth. We are getting food from Feeding America, Food Lion and Kroger. We have returned to our prior routine of packing the bags at the church with volunteers and

then loading up the cars and delivering them to Warm Hearth. We are being asked at this time to leave the bags at the door after knocking. We are packing generic bags and are not providing a menu selection option as in the past but this has been working well. The bags contain some basic items: tuna, peanut butter, soup, spaghetti, cereal, fruit cups and crackers in addition to any special items we may be able to get from Feeding America.

We will be packing and delivering the 4th Tuesday of each month. At this time, we are packing at 10 a.m. and then leaving immediately after to deliver. We are excited to be back delivering to the Seniors at Warm Hearth and look forward to continuing our program in this manner.

Our schedule for the next several months will be: November 23rd December 28th

We plan on adding some special items to the bags we pack in December, so please check the weekly Thursday emails for more details on what you can donate for the seniors as a special Christmas gift.

We will be collecting **peanut butter** (16 oz.) in **November**.

Community Thanksgiving Basket Pick Up - Saturday, November 20



St. Michael will again be handing out Thanksgiving Baskets to those in our community. Because of COVID-19, high unemployment and food insecurities, the need to feed those in our neighborhood is greater than ever.

Like last year, the Thanksgiving Baskets will be handed out at a **drive-through pick up only on the Saturday before Thanksgiving, November 20th.** We plan on packing at 9:30 a.m. and pick up will be 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. We feel we will have a better turnout and those receiving the baskets will have more time to prepare the meals since all the items in the baskets will be canned or boxed.

With the COVID restrictions, we feel this is the best way to serve everyone safely.

To Our House – November 20-26

To Our House is a service offered by New River Community Action to house homeless men and women during the winter months.

This year St. Michael has volunteered to provide meals in November for November 20th through November 26th. We are still working out the final details on how we will be setting up the meals and deliveries, so please look for further information. Our Savior Lutheran Church in Christiansburg will be the host church during the week we will be



providing meals. New River Community Action will be staffing and serving, and they will have several safety measures in place like last year.

We will be providing breakfast and lunch food and making hot meals for dinner. We are looking for volunteers who can either provide the food and paper products that will be needed for those meals or provide monetary donations to help buy larger refrigerated items. We may also need volunteers (1 to 2 per night) to help deliver the food to Our Savior Lutheran Church.

Jody Smiley and Dianne Krallman will be the coordinators this year and we will have a method for signing up electronically. That electronic signup sheet should be available in early November.
