

We are now in our 12th week of the new school year delivery. To date we have packed 2,874 backpacks, 17,244 meals and 40,236 items of food. This was all done through 845 hours of volunteer work.

Micah's Soup for Seniors

We are continuing to pack and distribute over 100 bags to the seniors at Warm Hearth. We are getting food from Feeding America, Food Lion and Kroger. We have returned to our prior routine of packing the bags at the church with volunteers and then loading up the cars and delivering them to Warm Hearth. We are being asked at

this time to leave the bags at the door after knocking. We are packing generic bags and are not providing a menu selection option as in the past but this has been working well. The bags contain some basic items: tuna, peanut butter, soup, spaghetti, cereal, fruit cups and crackers in addition to any special items we may be able to get from Feeding America.

We will be packing and delivering the 4th Tuesday of each month. At this time, we are packing at 10 a.m. and then leaving immediately after to deliver. We are excited to be back delivering to the seniors at Warm Hearth and look forward to continuing our program in this manner.

End-of-Year Giving and IRA Required Minimum Distribution Information

If you are planning to make a gift at the end of the year to support the ministry of St. Michael, remember that the IRS requires all gifts for 2021 to be received by the church or post-marked by December 31, 2021. You can make gifts to support the core ministry and to other ministries of St. Michael. You can find more information about these funds or donate online at: http://www.st-michael-lutheran-church.org/donations/. If you need assistance with tax advantageous gifts like gifts of stock or donations of minimum distributions from an IRA, contact Doug Smiley.

If you are at least 72 years old and need to take a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA, you have an opportunity to support St. Michael Lutheran Church and save money on your taxes. Under the current tax law, a gift made directly from an IRA to a qualifying charitable organization counts toward your required IRA minimum distribution requirement. Making a gift directly from your IRA to St. Michael Lutheran Church allows you to support a ministry you love and to lower both your adjusted gross income and your taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability. Talk to your tax advisor to find out if this strategy will work for you.
