January we have packed 3,146 bags, which equates to 18,876 meals and 44,044 items of food. Thank you to our congregation, our community, and our volunteers. Without you all this could not be possible.

We have been blessed to be joined by some of the VT Football coaching staff. A big THANK YOU to Coach Joe, Coach Crist, Coach Glenn and Coach Price for joining the players in helping us pack.

### Micah's Soup for Seniors

We are continuing to pack and distribute 100 bags to the seniors at Warm Hearth. We are getting ready to make changes to the menu and also to add some personal care items to the bags. The menu has been the same for

several years so we are looking forward to the changes and feel the new items will benefit the seniors. We are adding more single serve portions, such as small cans of vegetables, small microwavable rice and potatoes, beanie weenies, small boxes of cereal and small cans of beef stew. Most of our seniors live alone so this will allow them to more easily fix their dinners and lunches without waste. Also, every other month, we will add some personal care items. This change and our decision to alter the menu came about after having conversations with the seniors on what items they needed. We will be asking for donations from the congregation to fund the personal care items and will use Thrivent grants to make up the difference.

We are excited about the changes and look forward to our continued support of Micah's Soup for Seniors program at Warm Hearth. We invite anyone interested in packing and distributing the bags to join us the 4th Tuesday of each month at 10 a.m.
