

Micah's Caring Initiative Sharing the Story

Micah's Backpack

We have now been into our 2022-2023 school year for a month and a half as of this writing. As of November 9th, we have packed 2,975 bags of food, provided 17,850 meals and received 41,650 items of food.

We have been contacted by Angela Martin from Member One Federal Credit Union in Roanoke. Member One has partnered with the Virginia Tech women's basketball team and is collaborating on a fundraiser to

benefit Micah's Backpack and Micah's Soup for Seniors. The fundraiser will continue through the end of the season (February 2023).

Virginia Tech's Pi Sigma Epsilon business fraternity will be hosting a food drive for MBP over the next few weeks. The apartment complex Park 37 will also be hosting a food drive this month. Please stay tuned for updates.

For the Thanksgiving break, in addition to the regular packed food, we added cans of beef stew for our students and their families.

The Virginia Tech women's lacrosse team held a yearly food drive and made a donation to MBP.

In December, the University Club of Virginia Tech will be celebrating their one-year anniversary with a fundraiser. Micah's Backpack will be the featured non-profit organization and the recipient of the collected funds.

Many VT sororities and fraternities as well as local businesses pack for MBP. Anyone is invited to stop by one Wednesday evening to join us in packing or just to engage with these wonderful volunteers. Cookies are always welcomed.

Micah's Mini Pantry

We are restocking several times a week. Currently we have plenty of toothpaste. Items we need most are canned vegetables, canned fruit, shelf stable milk boxes, soups, pasta sauces, peanut butter, jelly, Ramen noodles/ready rice, canned chicken and tuna, hand soap, small size household items (laundry soap, dish soap, etc.).

End-of-Year Giving and IRA Required Minimum Distribution Information

If you are planning to make a gift at the end of the year to support the ministry of St. Michael, remember that the IRS requires all gifts for 2022 to be received by the church or post-marked by December 31, 2022. You can make gifts to support the core ministry and to other ministries of St. Michael. You can find more information about these funds or donate online at: http://www.st-michael-lutheran-church.org/donations/. If you need assistance with tax advantageous gifts like gifts of stock or donations of minimum distributions from an IRA, contact Doug Smiley at smileydc@vt.edu.

If you are at least 72 years old and need to take a Required Minimum Distribution from your IRA, you have an opportunity to support St. Michael Lutheran Church and save money on your taxes. Under the current tax law, a gift made directly from an IRA to a qualifying charitable organization counts toward your required IRA minimum distribution requirement. Making a gift directly from your IRA to St. Michael Lutheran Church allows you to support a ministry you love and to lower both your adjusted gross income and your taxable income, resulting in a lower overall tax liability. Talk to your tax advisor to find out if this strategy will work for you.
