Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

Have you ever asked yourself how life is different now that the tomb is empty?

The fifty days of Easter are filled with the theme of new life that follow naturally from the Lenten mystery of the impeding tomb. What was once hidden and unseen in the season of Lent blooms forth, and the beauty of new growth reverberates in our life as well as in the natural world throughout the northerner hemisphere.

The Holy Spirit emerges more fully during the season of Easter, bringing with it the power to transform our lives and reshape the world. Imagery of breath, wind, and Spirit provide bookends for this season starting with the story of Thomas and the disciples receiving the Hold Spirit through the breath of Jesus and ending with the disciples in Acts on the Day of Pentecost.

The Old Testament frequently described God as a helper who comes to the aid of his people (*Psalm 10:14; 30:10; 54:4; 63:7*). Jesus later promised that this help would become even more present, profound, and personal to God's people. This promise becomes reality when his Father sends "another Helper, to be with us forever" (*John 14:16*).

The Helper (Greek: parakletos) is a distinctive title for the Holy Spirit, who was poured out on the day of Pentecost. It is the Spirit of Christ who resides in the heart of every true believer (Romans 8:9-11; Ephesians 1:13-14). This Helper is our ever-present source of counsel, instruction, guidance, discernment, gifting, comfort, transformation, strength and power. Thanks to the gift of the Holy Spirit, we can be bold and brave, knowing that this Mighty Helper gives us all the help we need.

O God, you open the hearts of your faithful people by sending into us your Holy Spirit. Direct us by the light of that Spirit, that we may have a right judgment in all things and rejoice at all times in your peace, through Jesus Christ, your Son and our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

We will have fabric available to work with but if you have "good" scissors please bring them. We will be cutting out the patterns for the women that are "sewers" so they can work on them at home.
