

As we prepare to start another school year, we are busy stocking the shelves and organizing our dedicated volunteers. Montgomery County Public Schools begin classes on Wednesday, August 16th. We will continue to send bags to the Interfaith Food Pantry until our first delivery to the schools on September 8th. This will ensure



there are no gaps in the food families receive from Micah's Backpack. The partnership with the food pantry was a success and we hope to work with them again next summer. We have packed 850 bags so far this summer. Thank you to everyone who came out to the benefit night at Zeppoli's Restaurant. Zeppoli's sent us a check for \$138 to be used towards food this school year. On Monday afternoon I had the opportunity to accept a check for \$1,512 from the Fit Body Boot Camp in Blacksburg. Holly Kobia and her wonderful staff put on a fundraiser for Micah's Backpack on the Virginia Tech campus. Athletes from all over Virginia competed in the Fit Body Games. They matched all donations and exceeded their fundraising goal!

In case you are not familiar with Micah's Closet. Each fall and spring we provide up to a week's worth of new school clothes for children in need at PFES. Studies show that children in need are more likely to have higher self-

confidence and maintain regular school attendance if their clothes are as nice as clothing worn by their peers.

Micah's Closet volunteers purchase the clothing and return the clothes to St. Michael. Volunteers place the clothing in a separate colorful reusable bag for each child and deliver the bags to the school. School staff members deliver the gifts of clothing to selected children.

Preisch (Price) Family in America 285th Anniversary Celebration September 15-16

To celebrate this important event, The Price Family Historical Society is very pleased to host a celebration for the 285th Anniversary of the Preisches who arrived in America in 1738. The



event will take place at Price's Fork Elementary School on September 15th starting at 6 p.m. with light refreshments and a presentation from Jimmie Price. The event continues on Saturday morning starting at 10 a.m. with presentations from local authors and historians, Bob Hill, April Martin and Rebecca Novy. If you're wondering what an AED is - and why they seem to be

located in most offices and public buildings, you're not alone. In fact, because these devices are now commonly available, more people than ever before are curious about them. So – just what is an AED?

An AED, or automated external defibrillator, is used to help those experiencing sudden cardiac arrest. It's a sophisticated, yet **easy-to-use**, medical device that can analyze the heart's rhythm and, if necessary, deliver an electrical shock, or defibrillation, to help the heart re-establish an effective rhythm.
