The 2012-2013 To Our House (TOH) season got well underway after a successful completion of the second season of the program. Like years past, the summer months provided an opportunity to gather volunteers and prepare for the third season. This season was full of fellowship, warmth, and compassion. Each night, guests were transported to the host site and provided a hot meal, shower, and a warm and safe place to sleep. Most importantly, volunteers welcomed the men and made each guest feel valued and cared for.

The TOH model works because of the quality and commitment of the volunteers and what they bring to the host sites each night. A celebratory appreciation event for all our volunteers was hosted by TOH staff and the Policy Council in April at Blacksburg Presbyterian Church. Members of Pembroke FUMC generously catered a delicious buffet, prizes were donated by NRV restaurants and businesses, and two letters of appreciation from TOH guests were read to the group, one crediting "the churches" and TOH with "saving the life of this homeless man." As experiences were shared, it was evident that mutual and heart-felt blessings occur between both guests and volunteers alike.
