CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you received something for free.
- · God gives a free gift to all who have faith in Jesus? What is it?
- While God gives us the gift of his grace for free, what did it cost Jesus?
- What is your response to God's free gift of grace?

DEVOTIONS

October 31 is Reformation Day, a day to celebrate the reform that came to the Christian Church in the 1500's. As part of your household devotional times this week, review the life story of the great reformer, Martin Luther. Discover how he took a stand for the truth of the Gospel. (A good website to look at is: http://www.luther.de/en/leben.html.) Give thanks to God for people who have influenced members of your household through their Christian witness.

SERVICE

Jesus said, "Freely you have received, freely give." (Matthew 10:8) In celebration of Reformation Day (which is associated with the color red) organize a "gift of red" to give to a neighbor this week such as cookies or a cake coated with red icing, or a bouquet of red flowers. Work together to prepare and deliver your gift.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The beginning of the Reformation is often associated with Martin Luther's posting of 95 theses on the front door of the University Chapel in Wittenberg, Germany. Work together to write "we believe" statements on red streamers or strips of red paper. Attach these to the front door of your home in commemoration of Reformation Day.
