SAY, PRAY, AND BLESS:

CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- What is the most wonderful place you have ever visited? Why?
- God gave the apostle John a vision of a new heaven and a new earth (Revelation 21:1-4). What do you imagine they will be like?
- Jesus tells us to love one another. When is it easy/difficult to love others?

DEVOTIONS



Read the wonderful description of love found in 1 Corinthians 13:1-8. Work together on a definition of love that applies to your household. For example:

- Love is being patient when someone else is late.
- Love is being kind when someone else is hurt or feeling sad.

Pray together for God's help to show genuine love to one another.

SERVICE



Jesus tells us that we should show ourselves to be his disciples by the way we love others. Think of someone who is difficult for you to like. Pray for understanding and acceptance of this person.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



In his book, *The Five Love Languages of Children*, Gary Chapman explains that children are designed by God to give and receive love in different ways. Chapman suggests that there are five particular love languages that parents need to be aware of: words of affirmation, quality time, gifts, acts of service, and physical touch.

Talk together about what makes us feel loved, such as a hug, an act of service, a kind word or note, or a gift. Write up a list of these and post them in a prominent place. Focus this week on performing acts of love towards one another.
