CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- Tell about a time that you felt a sense of peace that felt filled with God's presence.
- How might the peace that Jesus gives be different than the peace that is usually understood in daily life (John 14:27)?
- Jesus promises the coming of the Holy Spirit who is described as a companion who teaches us Jesus' message. Tell about a time the Holy Spirit seemed to walk alongside and teach you.

DEVOTIONS



In Acts 16:13-15, Paul and his companions share their faith with a woman named Lydia, and the Lord opened her heart to the message that Paul gave. She then opened her home to Paul and his friends. Her home became a place to encourage one another in the faith (see verse 40). How does the Lord open your heart to hear the message of Jesus with faith? How is your home a place to nurture the Christian faith?

SERVICE



When Lydia became a Christian, she invited the Apostle Paul and his companions into her home (Acts 16:15). Invite an individual or group into your home for Christian fellowship. Consider using portions of Taking Faith Home to encourage one another in the faith.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



This Thursday (May 5th) is Ascension Day. In many Christian churches this day goes by virtually unnoticed, but it is actually one of the five great festivals of the church and has been celebrated since the fourth century. It marks the last earthly appearance of the Lord Jesus after his resurrection (Mark 16:19; Luke 24:50-53, and Acts 1:1-12). Ascension Day falls on the 40th day of the Easter season.

The ascension clarifies the meaning of resurrection. Jesus is the enthroned Lord of heaven and earth forevermore. Put a white or gold piece of cloth over a cross to recall the triumph of God's love over sin and death.
