## CARING CONVERSATIONS

- Can you remember a time when you felt Jesus helping you? Tell your story.

## DEVOTIONS 🔌

The best way to understand faith is to experience it. Pair up with friends or family to take a "faith walk." Have one person blindfolded, and the other is the guide who uses verbal cues to lead the person on a walk. Switch roles, and then talk about your experiences. Discuss what it means to live by faith in Jesus as our trustworthy guide and helper.
