CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- What does your name mean? Do you know why it was chosen for you?
- The angel told Joseph to give Mary's son the name Jesus, which means "the Lord saves us." What did Jesus' name indicate about his life? What does it mean to you that Jesus was born?
- A title for Jesus is Immanuel, which means, "God with us." How have you experienced God with you recently?

DEVOTIONS



Light all four candles on your Advent Wreath and say these words.

Say: This is the fourth and last week of Advent. Together with the candles of waiting, hope, and joy, we light the candle of peace. At the birth of Jesus the angels sang, "Praise God in Heaven! Peace on earth to everyone who pleases God." Jesus came to give us peace with God. Through him we can live at peace with one another. [The candles are lit.]

Read: Luke 2:8-14.

Pray: O God, as the season of Advent comes to a close we are excited at the coming of Christmas. In our excitement, help us not to forget the reason for our celebrations. Thank you for Jesus, our Savior and Prince of Peace. Bless our home with your peace. Amen.

SERVICE
