CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Reformation means change. Talk about a time when you experienced change in your life.
- Jesus says that the one who commits sin is a slave to sin. What enslaves you or keeps you from loving God and neighbor?
- Jeremiah 31:31-34 promises a new covenant for God's people and a time when God will remember people's sins no more. What is it like to have a God who not only forgives but also forgets?

DEVOTIONS

Reformation Day on October 31st recognizes the day in 1517 when Martin Luther posted 95 theses (or statements) of belief on the doors of a church in Wittenberg, Germany. They were written to challenge the teachings and practices of the church of Luther's day.

Luther wrote "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," a hymn that is deeply associated with the Reformation. Based on Psalm 46, it celebrates faith and confidence in God, no matter what happens around us. Pray Psalm 46 and the words of "A Mighty Fortress." List the things that are going on in your life and the world around you that challenge your faith. Then, after each of those challenges, recite the worlds of Psalm 46:1, "God is our mighty fortress, always ready to help in times of trouble."

SERVICE

The Reformation lifts up the power and grace of God's word. Bring the Taking Faith Home sheet with you on a visit to someone who is homebound. Use portions of Taking Faith Home with that person and together experience the freeing power of the gospel of Jesus Christ.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

The Christian faith acknowledges the power of sin and the need for our lives to be set free through confession and forgiveness. Gather together with family or friends, light a candle and make a public confession of sins by reciting Psalm 51:1-10. Then, offer one another words of forgiveness by saying:

"[Name of person], in the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven."

You may substitute "A Blessing to Give" for the words of forgiveness.
