CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- Throughout the Bible, being invited to a banquet offers a beautiful experience of peace and joy. How can you experience peace and joy in your mealtimes today?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Philippians 4:4-9 twice slowly.

Say aloud the word or phrase that stands out for you. Reflect on that word or phrase. Read the text again and wonder how the passage gives helpful guidance to your life. Read the text one final time and make a decision about how this passage will direct your thoughts and actions in the days ahead.

Close by praying Psalm 23 and the Lord's Prayer.

SERVICE
