PRAYERS AND BLESSING

A Prayer for the Week:

CARING CONVERSATIONS



Discuss in your home or small group:

- What do you think Mary was feeling after the birth of Jesus?
- When Simeon and Anna saw Jesus in the temple, they praised God. What would you
 have done when you saw Jesus?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Psalm 148.

Read the psalm three times slowly with reflective pauses between the readings. What word or phrase captures your thinking and imagination? The psalm encourages all that God has created to give praise to God. Use this psalm as a basis for writing your own psalm of praise honoring Christ's birth. Use familiar images and ideas.

Pray: Lord God, thank you for Jesus, through whom we are adopted as your children. Let all you have made praise you! Amen.
