DEVOTIONS

Read: Matthew 25:14-30.

The parable of the talents encourages us to trust God and live boldly. The rewards for such faith will be great in the kingdom of God. Conversely, faith is not to be squandered and buried. The people of God have been entrusted with the greatest treasure imaginable, God's saving love. It is a sobering thought to waste such a treasure. It is the call of all the faithful to risk it all for the sake of God's kingdom of love and happiness. Talk about the treasured gift of God's love and how to share it with others. Then pray:

Dear God, give us courage and confidence to live daily with faith, hope, and love in Christ. Amen.
